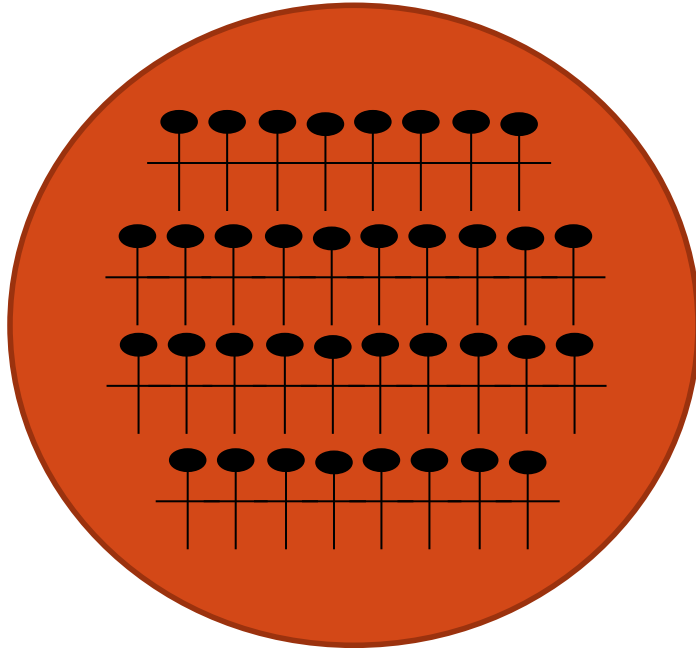

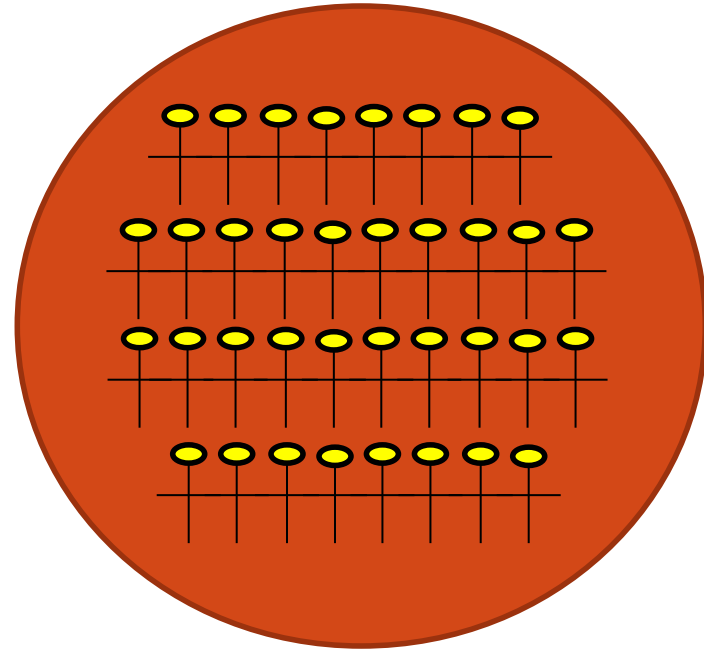
Most traits are inherited independently of one another. The genes for skin color have nothing to do with the genes for hair texture, eye shape, musical talent, blood type, athletic ability.






Continent 1

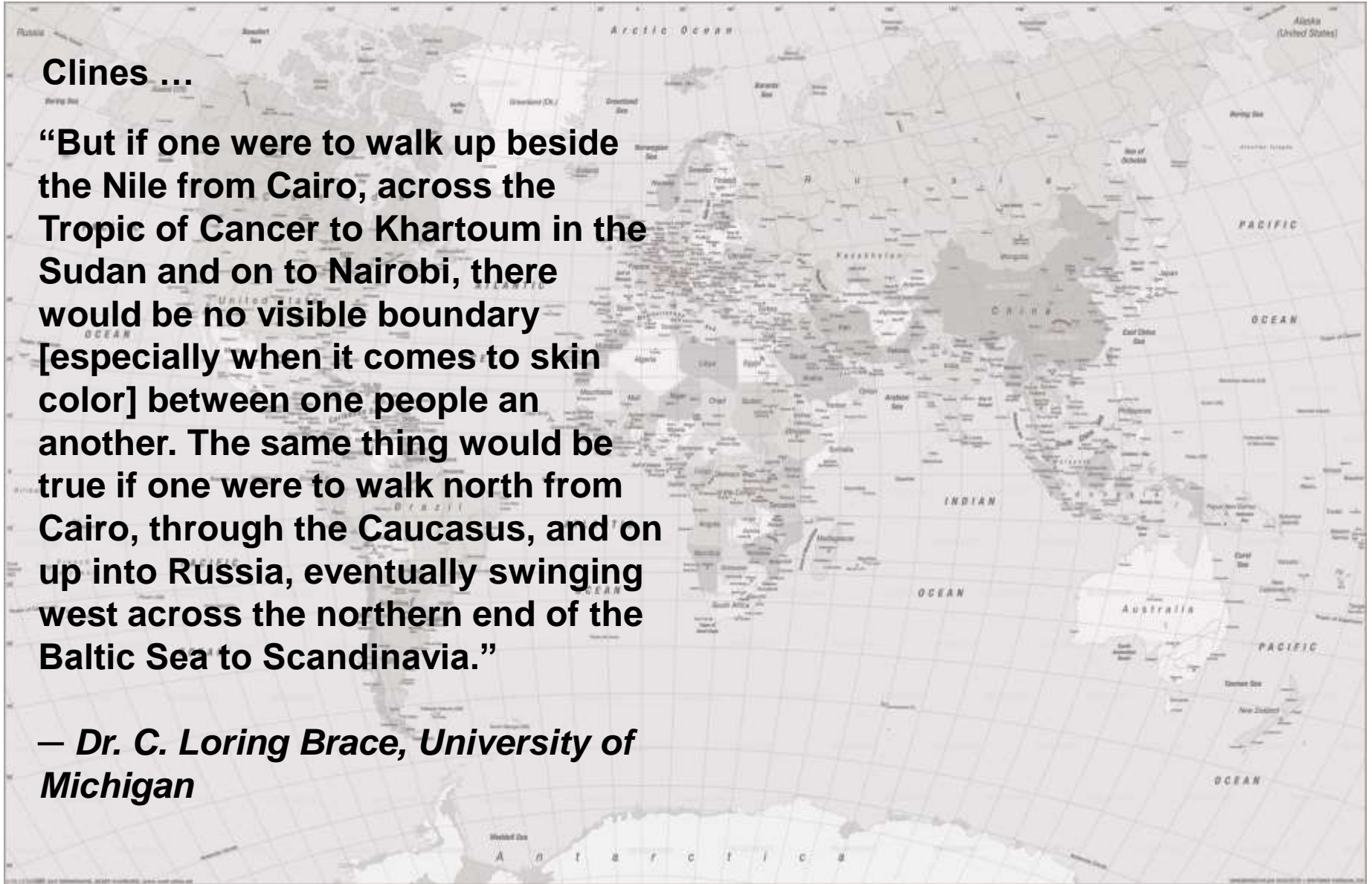
The term **Clines**: A biological term that examines the gradual change in certain characteristics [like skin color] exhibited by members of a series of adjacent populations or organisms of the same species.



“But if one were to walk up beside the Nile from Cairo, across the Tropic of Cancer to Khartoum in the Sudan and on to Nairobi, there would be no visible boundary [especially when it comes to skin color] between one people and another. The same thing would be true if one were to walk north from Cairo, through the Caucasus, and on up into Russia, eventually swinging west across the northern end of the Baltic Sea to Scandinavia.”

“... [N]atural selection can exaggerate some of the differences between groups, making them appear more dissimilar on the surface than they are underneath (genetically). Because traits such as skin color have been strongly affected by natural selection, they do not necessarily reflect the (Overall) population processes that have shaped the distribution of neutral polymorphisms ... Therefore, traits (like skin color) affected by natural selection may be poor predictors of group membership and may imply group relatedness where, in fact, none exists.”
